### PARABLES OF JESUS

A New Series of reflections on the Parables of Jesus from Pastor Adrian.

We all love stories, whether it be bedtime stories or stories around the kettle over a cup of tea. We all enjoy a good tale, yarn or story and Jesus told many and they are called parables. The parables that Jesus told describe what the Kingdom of Heaven is like, not just heaven the place, but heaven as a Kingdom with a real purpose. Jesus told parables to illustrate spiritual truth with everyday things and I think they have much to tell us about the way we live our lives today. This month's choice is the very well known Parable of the Sower found in Luke 8 of the bible.

Jesus was ever keen to open the eyes and ears of people to see and hear what God was actually doing; so he told the story of a farmer sowing in a field. The seed fell all over the place; some on the roadside, some on stony ground, some amongst thorns and some fell in good soil. Where it fell and how it grew was really important and Jesus went on to say that the seed is the word of God. Sometimes people hear the word and then bad things come along and distract them from living it. Some people hear the word and receive it with great delight and enthusiasm but they don't have firm enough roots and they only believe for a short period of time. Some people who hear the word are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life; entangled by all this they don't bear any fruit. Finally, there are some who hear the word and hold onto it with an upright and good heart and they produce good fruit for the Kingdom. (Tom Wright; Luke for Everyone, 2001).

I don't know where you place yourself in any those categories but I do know that many of us find it tough to produce good fruit for the Kingdom. If you look around you at the all people in our community and ask yourself; what sort of soil is the word of God being sown in today? What can we do to plough up the rough ground, remove some of the stones and weed out the thorns? What can we do to sow the word of God more successfully? Perhaps the first PTO

and most important answer is to ask ourselves how much growth, how much good fruit is the word of God producing in our own lives?

If there is anything you wish to ask or is troubling you or causing you difficulty please pick up the phone and talk to us - you will find our numbers in the back of this magazine. Covid-19 may have restricted our use of our buildings but the church is very much alive and active in the community.

Until we meet again, may I take this opportunity, along with everyone at the *Three Valley Methodist Churches*, to wish you and your family every blessing and may the Peace of God be with you now and always.

### LOCAL GOVERNMENT NEWS

#### Dear Reader

The Royal Cornwall Hospital is of course our main acute hospital for Cornwall, and it is built in the Parish of Kenwyn (not diocese parish but local government parish). It is wonderful news that in early September our National Government announced an early release of funds to ensure that the facilities to form a Women's and Children's Centre are completed by 2024 - a year earlier than previously planned. RCHT is submitting outline planning permission in the next few weeks.

The Cornwall Foundation Trust (which oversees all the community hospitals and mental health services in the county) and the Royal Cornwall Hospital Trust are to amalgamate and form one Health Trust for Cornwall which will enable our health provision to be better organized and the people of Cornwall will be able to access health treatments in specialist areas and in many cases nearer their homes. So, it is very exciting times for our health provision in our county.

There appears to be an increase in the number of people being tested positively for Covid-19, which is very worrying. The government have had to change the rules in which we live, but too many people are still saying that these rules do not apply to them! I beseech all the Readers of the Parish Lantern to remain very vigilant and take care and remember the Rule of 6 as well as HANDS, FACE and SPACE.

As I have mentioned before the next Local Government elections to Parish and to Cornwall Council are scheduled to take place in May 2021 unless they are postponed as they are deemed not P.T.O.

safe to be held. A further reminder to all Residents that the Cornwall Council has been reduced by the National Boundary Commission from the current 123 to 87 members. This means that the workload for these Members is bound to increase with 36 less Councilors. The present division that I represent will lose the Shortlanesend Ward of Kenwyn Parish (being subsumed into Trehaverne Ward Truro) as well as the Baldhu Ward of Kea Parish which will be taken in Kea Division. The new ward created will retain the Greenbottom Ward of Kenwyn, all Chacewater Parish and gain most of the Threemilestone Ward of Kenwyn Parish.

So, lots of changes ahead for us in 2021. Just let us hope that there has been significant advances and our scientists are able to help us get back to living more normal lives. In the meantime, please stay safe and look after yourselves.

### CHACEWATER RIGHTS OF WAY (CRoW) WALK Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> Sept 2020

Distance 3.28miles approx. Start 9.30 am Time 2 Hours Weather Drizzle/Sunny Intervals

On a pleasant morning, with a little light rain and sunny spells, 11 Walkers and 1 Dog, assembled in the Village Carpark at 9.15am ready for a 9.30am departure. We headed up Church Hill, briefly pausing at the layby by the Parish Church to enjoy panoramic views of the village. Then on up Church Hill, passing Chacewater House, and 2 more houses on the left until we arrived at the bridleway. A broad open track also used by agricultural vehicles which passes through a patchwork of small fields, the last section of the path as it approaches the Twelve Heads road, narrows considerably, but has recently been cleared so access is good.

At the road we turned right, after about 50 Yards we were able to turn left down the bridle which curves down the hill into the Poldice Valley towards Todpool. From this path there are clear views across the mining remains in Poldice, stretching up to Croft Handy, St Day with Carn Marth in the background. This is also one of the paths that has been cleared by the new contractor, so is clear and offers easy walking. At the end of the path we than turned left down the hill following the road into Tod Pool and along the wooded road which is also part of the Devoran – Porthreath Trail, Crossing the main Chacewater/St Day road, heading towards Wheal Bush, after about a quarter of a mile the trail then forks left off the road and on to the edge of Unity Woods, as we arrived at the edge of the woods, we turned sharp right to follow the pathway passing the Engine Houses at Wheal Bush on up the hill to Cox Hill and Truro Tractors.

Following the road towards Chacewater for about 500yds until we reached a broad pathway on the right which passes through fields with good views over the village past the old guarry.

At the next junction in the path we followed the left fork down the hill past Anzac Cottage, the path then drops steeply down the hill to the main road. We then walked down the High Street, returning to our starting point in the Carpark. The next walk will take place on Sunday 4th October (Covid19 Restrictions Permitting)

### A MESSAGE FROM REVD CASPAR BUSH (RURAL DEAN)

Plans are progressing for the regrouping of the churches in our area, so I wanted to give you an update, particularly if you are reading this as someone who may not be closely involved in the churches. The beauty and uniqueness of the Church of England is that our churches belong to everyone, not simply those who attend.

The churches in the south and east of our area, namely Feock, Devoran and Perranarworthal, are becoming one group called The Riverside Churches, and they will be served by a yet-to-be-appointed parish priest living in Carnon Downs.

The other churches at Chacewater, St Day, Carharrack, Gwennap and Stithians will form the other group - the name for this group is not yet decided – and they will be served by a parish priest living at St Day, also yet to be appointed. If you have a good idea about what to call this group please get in touch!

One of the big changes we are preparing for is a move away from a reliance on retired clergy to help us run Sunday services. The pandemic has meant that a number of these faithful priests have decided it's no longer realistic to carry on serving the churches as they did before. This has given us a rather wonderful opportunity to arrange for many more services to be led by lay-leaders in our churches. We are already blessed with a good number of volunteer, trained local worship leaders and licensed local ministers (also known as Readers), but it's fair to say that in recent years some of these leaders have felt under-used, or even overlooked. That is about to be put right. We'll also be on the look-out for new people to be trained for these roles from within our churches.

Elsewhere in Truro Diocese some of these lay-led services end up being the most popular services in their churches, because those who take them have longer between services to plan them, and don't have to rush in and out of churches on a Sunday like clergy often do. So we pray God will bless this new opportunity to bring new insights and encouragement and growth to our churches, as well as new impetus for our churches to serve the communities they're in.

# VILLAGE PONDWATCH September 2020



Summer is ending. Rain re-filled the pond in August and the water remains clean. Some work has been done to control spreading mats of fringed water lily that could choke the surface. Water stick insects struggle to penetrate the dense vegetation and patrol

small patches of open water. They lurk at the edge of the weeds and hunt below the leaves.

When it is dry and overcast, a slight breeze makes the pond water gently shiver. This does not deter a new generation of pondskaters as many skitter across the surface. Several gather to watch and wait round a crashed insect that cannot walk on water.

Despite strong, gusting winds, a Southern Hawker dragonfly makes repeated circuits of the pond. Sometimes, he is harassed by a Common Darter dragonfly that quickly resumes his perch. A common blue damselfly clings to a leaf – now and again he ventures out over the water when the wind drops. In early evening a Common Hawker dragonfly hooks her tail beneath a lily leaf and takes time to lay some eggs. Then she moves to another





leaf. A Southern Hawker with bolder green and black stripes also lays eggs as she grasps a stalk of old bulrush.

Overhead, carder bumble bees continue to work on shrinking stands of purple loosestrife. White butterflies also frequently pause to graze. Small birds duck in and out of the drying thickets as leaves start to fall from the trees over the pond.

# IN MEMORIAM Pte. Herbert SANDOW Duke of Cornwall's L. I. Died 31 March 1918

Herbert Edwin Sandow was 19 years old when Britain entered the Great War in August 1914. He joined the Territorial Force, 1<sup>st</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> Battalion of the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry, and served with this unit when it went to France in May 1916.

Herbert's parents, Emily & John Sandow, lived at Tresize Farm on Kerley Down with their family of 5 sons and one daughter. His sister, Beatrice, was 4 years older than him. He had two elder brothers and two younger. One brother, Martin Henry, died aged 27 in February 1915 and is buried in Chacewater. Beatrice got married two months later and their youngest brother left school the same year. In 1916, his 19-year-old brother Percy enlisted with the army and served with the 1st Bn. D.C.L.I.

In France, Pte. Herbert Sandow (240812) and the 1/5<sup>th</sup> Bn. [Pioneers for the 61<sup>st</sup> (2<sup>nd</sup> South Midlands) Division] joined the ill-fated attack at Fromelles on 19<sup>th</sup> July. They spent the cold Somme winter at work between the towns of Albert and Arras. In January 1917 there were cautious advances along the Ancre valley and then, following the German Retreat to the Hindenburg Line, they reached Gricourt near St Quentin in March.

Herbert's unit went north to Ypres in the summer and fought at Langemark-Poelkapell in August 1917. Returning to France, they faced German

counter-attacks on 1<sup>st</sup> December at Villers-Plouich outside Cambrai. As the British army line extended during the winter, Herbert and the 1/5<sup>th</sup> Bn. were in the small village of Hombleux, south-west of St Quentin, at the end of March 1918. The German Spring Offensive swept through the area and forced back the British troops.

Losses were high on both sides and Pte. Herbert Sandow was killed in action on 31st March 1918. His name is commemorated alongside 14,700 others on the Pozières memorial. 134 soldiers of the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry are recorded here, one quarter of whom served with the 1/5th Battalion and 30 of them died on the same day as Herbert. Herbert's sacrifice is remembered also by the Chacewater war memorial and on his brother's gravestone.

#### IN MEMORIAM

# Pte. Percy SANDOW Duke of Cornwall's L. I. 1st Bn. Died 09 Sept 1970

Born on 10<sup>th</sup> June 1897, Percy Charles Sandow was 2 years younger than his brother Herbert. He completed three month's military training after his 19<sup>th</sup> birthday and arrived in France on 29<sup>th</sup> September 1916 with replacement troops for the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry, 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion. *This front-line unit had been in action in France and Belgium since August 1914. They fought on the Somme in July and throughout September 1916; in Flanders again in 1917 and back to the Somme in 1918, joining the final advances in Picardy Oct/Nov.* 

Pte. Percy Sandow (26318) served through the winter months on the Somme and was sent back to England in February 1917 before the 1<sup>st</sup> D.C.L.I. joined the fight for Vimy ridge in April. Percy returned in October to Flanders where his unit was engaged in the Third battle of Ypres near Passchendaele. He survived an action on 26<sup>th</sup> October but sustained a gunshot wound to his ear on 6<sup>th</sup> Nov. Four weeks later Percy wrote to his parents at Kerley as he was leaving the Convalescent depot to return to the regiment where he spent another Christmas in the trenches.

In the Spring of 1918, Pte Percy Sandow and the 1<sup>st</sup> Bn. D.C.L.I. were in action in the battles of the Lys to hold the German offensive. They fought at Merville on 12<sup>th</sup> April and Percy was treated for the effects of a gas attack two weeks later. On 11<sup>th</sup> June, Percy got shot in the foot and was shipped back to England the next day. He remained in England for 5 months and would surely have got some leave to visit family in Chacewater.

Ten days after the Armistice, Percy Sandow re-joined his unit in France where he spent another winter in khaki. Finally, he was shipped home on 25<sup>th</sup> April 1919 and left the army 4 weeks later. Assessed with a 40% disability, Percy received a pension of 11 shillings a week. His father died on 18<sup>th</sup> May 1920 and his remaining brothers, William John and Frederick, sailed to America 3 months later. Percy stayed and farmed in Chacewater. He died at Lower Chacewood at the age of 73.
