



CROW WALK - 1st JULY 2025

Following some heavy rainfall overnight, the walk in July kept mainly to byways and broader bridleways that weren't overgrown and offered firmer ground underfoot.

Wheal Busy Lane byway. Halfway up, turn right onto a rocky bridleway that leads uphill and through a stock-gate by Hillside Farm. We continue uphill – snipping several bramble runners straggling across the trail. The bridleway soon widens with firm grass underfoot and banks of blackberries on each side. At the



We started with a few urban trails after leaving the Car Park, passing the Old Market and turn left to go uphill on Jake's Lane towards the Bowling Club. At Falmouth Road, turn right and in 100m cross High Street and go straight down Bakers Lane byway. Across the Leat on Sergeants Hill bridge and continue uphill to the Terrace where we turn left.

At another 100m we take the **right** fork and move steadily uphill on

top of the hill we look over Wheal Busy Downs and continue to walk along the well-compacted gravel surface of the bridleway.

Arriving at a junction, with a field-gate on the right, we **turn left** under an arching canopy of scrub oak trees. As we pass down the broad bridleway, the twin white domes of the Observatory for Cornwall can be seen through the hedgerows on the right-hand side.


We pause briefly by the post-box next to the poor Old Smithy and observe the building progress of four new dwellings over the road. Going straight across the road ourselves, we move up another broad bridleway past Pitslewren Farm. At a "T" junction we turn right and head north along this well-drained bridleway. We take a quick photo, turn right again at the next "T" junction and return to the road beside Duckworth's industrial park.

Some fast-moving cars and blind corners meant a direct return to the Old Smithy was too risky so we turn left up the road, move 100m

uphill and **turn right** at the crossroads. After 40m we leave the road, **turn right** again and go down the best-maintained bridleway which takes us safely back to the Wheal Busy Engine and Boiler House.

From here we return to the village on Wheal Busy Lane, back along the Terrace all the way to Station Road, across Fore Street and arrive at the Car Park by 11 am.

There is NO CRoW Walk in August. The next CRoW Walk is on Sunday 7th SEPTEMBER – meet at main Car Park 09.30am. Everybody welcome.

VILLAGE PONDWATCH -

JULY 2025

Did you wonder where the tadpoles went? Sharp-eyed visitors spotted several tiny toadlets wandering through the damp early-morning grass beside the pond.

The air around the pond is full of activity and there is constant movement over the water. In warm sunshine,



squadrons of damselflies dance across the pond just inches above the surface. They jink through the air over the water and jockey for position to perch on waterside plants. Every day, dozens of azure damselflies dodge around the plants and rest among the leaves. In a stiff breeze a single male tacks across the pond. Later, a mated pair of azure damselflies emerges from the reeds and alights on a small lily pad. A few red damselflies are vastly outnumbered.

A Broad Bodied Chaser dragonfly makes short flights over the water and returns to her favoured perch by the willow bush. Some Red darter dragonflies also came to a regular spot but quickly disappeared; perhaps more easily targeted by predatory birds.

White, brown and orange butterflies pass by frequently. Meadow Brown, Small Copper and bright orange-coloured Comma butterflies sometimes settle on a bramble leaf. Two pairs of Speckled Woods spiral upwards and small birds flutter in the hedgerow as a white butterfly footles among the bulrushes. Peacock and large Red Admiral butterflies find a buddleia bush while a bumblebee arrives noisily and weaves through the hedgerow with a continual loud buzzing.

On many days a large Southern Hawker dragonfly appears above the water and jinks to avoid a swooping sparrow. A male Hawker patrols tirelessly as a female hides on the bank. Later, the female, resplendent with lime green and dark bands, flies back and forth, high and low, across the pond. She hovers to examine visitors and side-slips deftly in the air to avoid another sparrow's attempted ambush.

There are white and some yellow fringed water lilies flowering. Bulrushes have set seed heads, knapweed and purple loosestrife plants are starting to bloom. The bramble thicket is impenetrable (except for birds, insects and small mammals) with a heavy crop of blackberries – the first ones are already ripe.

In the water, a newt cruises slowly near the bottom of the pond while small beetles swim by under the surface. Water Boatmen and Whirlygig beetles are active on the clear water. Many water beetles patrol the surface and each chases intruders from its space.

Here is a small photo gallery to help you to recognise some of the insects we see. Mostly dragonflies this month as the butterflies won't stay still.

Refuse in Jake's Lane

Concerns have been raised about rubbish that has accumulated in an area of Jake's Lane due to household waste being left out in an unacceptable way for weekly/fortnightly collection. The Suez team have their own instructions to follow and will not take items in the wrong containers.

We have all had to get used to the new collection schedule and containers, with food waste going in the green bin every week and general waste/recycling collected on alternate weeks. Despite notices being left as reminders, there are still containers being left with 'all sorts' in them and the situation now presents a health hazard and has been referred to Environmental Health. Please ensure that your waste is out on the correct day and in the correct container, as most of you already do.

"OUT AND ABOUT!"

Both Road Safety and Highways Management have been given a significant lift around Chacewater recently as Cormac staff have been out and about clearing many roadside grips. This will help drain any potential flood or surface waters that are likely to come in the Autumn and Winter period. It is vital that we think ahead here! Sharp on the heels of these works and on completion of the Highways works on Kerley Hill, Cormac have put a real effort in to reinstating the white road markings at many of our road junctions, as can be seen in these photos of Kerley Hill and Todpool entrance.



However, more needs to be done and so a check of all such junctions, lay-bys, etc. will be

documented and shared with Cormac. where the Parish Council believes they should form part of these works



Management of our Public Rights of Wav (PRoW). Our **PRoW** contract team and the Council Parish have engaged to ensure we maximise the funds allocated from Cornwall Council's Local Maintenance Partnership (LMP) for cutting

strimming our many Byways, Bridleways and Footpaths. The Parish Council matches those LMP funds and we believe what we have represents a good deal. Volunteers do step in to tackle some areas that need a "light touch" snip. It's very much a **TEAM effort.** Those who enjoy our PRoW can help out here by taking a pair of secateurs with them on a walk and snip away at any overgrowth they can reasonably and practically manage – it really does help to remove unwanted brambles, gorse, holly or bracken. Thank you in advance for anything you can do!

For some of us gardeners it may be a struggle keeping up with the watering requirements however, there are a number of plants that thrive in these conditions. Drought tolerant plants are adapted to survive with minimal water making them the ideal plants for gardens with limited water supplies. These plants can come in numerous forms from vibrant perennials to shrubs to striking succulents.

Lavender is a popular fragrant perennial that is known for its low maintenance and thrives in sandy well drained soils and requires full sun to flourish.

Succulents come in many forms and are great plants to plant in containers and thrive on little water and need very little attention. Many are quite simply stunning with their colourful leaves and leaf textures. Many succulents are quite small so are ideal for even the smallest of pots. Depending on your location, some succulents will need bringing in to protect from the winter frosts.

HELP MANAGE OUR MAIN CAR PARK

For many years we have achieved the right balance between resident and visitor parking in the **Main Square Car Park**. However, recently that balance has been lost on **some residents** and is now **causing more harm than they know**.

Rules and Regulations for use are clearly displayed above the post box in the car park and this is a timely reminder to us all to do our best to share the area for everyone's benefit. This is a busy space allowing visitors to access the health centre, shops and other local facilities.



A significant number of residents who do not have a parking place of their own use the Main Square Car Park instead and that's fine, so long as it's just the first car or (exceptionally) an 'in use' second vehicle; this has been the rule of thumb for many years now. However, we are seeing more and more residents parking vehicles categorised as long stayers (i.e. they do not move in weeks, months or over a year in one current case) and some are not even in date for tax or MOT, which is truly shocking.

So, a plea NOW to do the right thing. The only alternative will be to introduce some form of very costly enforcement system which will impact negatively on us all.

Community Garden

The very hot weather and lack of rain has tested most gardeners this year. Our water collection system and pumped storage containers have served us well and allowed regular watering to be done around the plot. although there was concern as water levels dropped! After poor growing results last year, we have kept choices simple but are amazed that the runner beans have just not appeared, they are usually one of the more reliable crops. Fruits and flowers have flourished with the top cut-flower area being a riot of colour, and it looks as though we will get our first crop of useable apples as the trees have now been in for three years.



The rose bed is filling up and we have been gifted another beautiful plant (thank you), "Midnight Blue" which will be a darker contrast to the pink and peach colours already there. We have also added a clematis to climb up the central obelisk – this came from

Roseland House (where they hold the national collection of viticellas). We had hoped to plant the variety named "Chacewater" but were advised that it may not do well in our exposed position so we have gone instead for "Cornish Spirit" which sounds just right for this community project.

This is a good place to mention the rose growing at the top of the car park steps which has flowered prolifically this year. It was planted to mark the royal platinum jubilee and is called "Queen Elizabeth II", chosen by the late Oueen to mark the occasion. At the time we could only get a bare root plant which was nothing more than a few leaves on stubby sticks and got rather lost amongst our celebrations. But it has grown, as we'd hoped, into a lasting memento of event. thanks the our to volunteers who look after the bank here, the colour is lovely to see and brightens the area throughout the year.

We are always looking for ways to improve the garden and give more useable space for the future. On grey, damp days we often move into the shed to complete planting/sowing/cuttings tasks, but it is dark with little natural light. Our clever 'elves' have been on the case and we now have a couple of strips of LED lighting which are powered from the leisure battery, which in turn is charged by the solar panel on the roof. The shed roof also provides our main water collection point so is a really important feature of the garden. Practical knowledge

and skills are shared in the group and it is a great way to learn, we are very lucky and every day is a school day! Summer pruning is now underway on some of the fruit trees and, again, we are learning how this should be done to get a good fruit crop next year. Books and online tips are helpful but it's great to watch someone doing this and ask questions – I shall be trying it out on my own apple trees this year.

One result of the hot sunny weather has been the abundance of grasses and wild flowers growing around the banks and edges of the garden. Another plus is that there are fewer weeds! Although the recent rain will probably encourage them back again - life is never easy.
