

What is a Climate Commission?



Climate Commissions are area-wide partnerships bringing together people and organisations from the public, private and civic sectors who work collaboratively to help drive, guide, support and track climate action.

Commissions are **independent bodies** that complement the activities of local government, combined authorities and local enterprise partnerships and that extend their reach and build an area's capacities to **deliver climate resilience and low carbon transitions**.



- Promote inclusive processes that involve and empower local actors, support meaningful representation of different groups and work towards fair/legitimate outcomes;
- Serve as an independent and trusted voice in the area, building climate/carbon literacy, acting as a critical friend and a focal point/clearing house for information;
- Inform, guide, support and track progress towards appropriate local climate targets and promote transparency;
- Review current activities, celebrate successes and promote the replication/scaling up of different forms of best practice;
- Provide neutral spaces for the review of different issues, and publish position papers on contentious issues to support informed, balanced debate;

What a Climate Commission is not?





- A place for marketing or lobbying
- An attempt to take over council responsibilities nor an extension of local authority powers
- A substitute for direct public representation
- A body that directly designs or delivers programmes or projects.
- Policy makers (but they can guide/advise on policy)
- A talking shop they are there to make a tangible difference in the delivery of climate action

and challenging all relevant parties to be accountable for their climate actions.

Challenge

Provide a challenge to Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly's leaders, communities, residents and organisations on effective delivery and impact of plans and policies. Champion and promote at a strategic level the response to climate change. Commission and provide technical advice and assurance to existing strategic groups, networks and organisations.

Catalyse


