

We welcomed our Member of Parliament, Jayne Kirkham, for a tour of the Parish on Saturday morning of 16th August. Trailed as a "Positives, Health and Wellbeing" visit, the driven route initially included the core of the village (talking traffic, listed housing, etc.), Kerley Hill (new highway narrowing scheme) and the Boscawen and Trevithick Road area, where we discussed completion of the long-awaited retrofit housing works. Then up and along the Bissoe Road to see where the Cornish Lithium site will be, before dropping down to view the new Play Park and Mineral Tramway at Twelveheads. We headed back to

Chacewater village via Creegbrawse and Todpool. the Hallenbeagle Material Recycling Facility (MRF) and Wheal Busy (a bit heritage) before an onsite meeting with many of the key players involved delivering New our Recreation Centre. The final port of call was our thriving



Community Garden, where we walked and chatted around this lovely space with a cup of tea and biscuit in hand. Before departing, Jayne stated that, despite some obvious difficulties, Chacewater is a place of so many positives, a clear sense of direction, energy and much promise. She thanked all involved for giving up their time to host this visit, which was most warmly welcomed.

OUT AND ABOUT!

Following last month's article about Road Safety and Highways Management, further thanks to Cormac for completing the white line road safety works at all junctions across the Parish.

Warning! Months of dry weather have left many of our drains covered in silt, etc. Now is the time to prepare for the autumn wet weather. So please see if you can do a bit to help free up some of these water catchment points if you can.

Further works have taken place in the Main Car Park throughout August, with a final load of mulch spread on the reclaimed Riverbank flower and shrub bed - which now looks really great.



Re-painting the outside of the WI Hall was also completed this month, with the lower walled section given a good lick of white masonry paint.

Mr Northey also has been out and about digging out the weeds beside the Recreation Ground pathway, strimmed other grass banks and pathways, mown Chacewater Hill, the Recreation Ground pitch as well as our heavily used Play Areas. Your efforts are always appreciated Richey!

CHACEWATER PARISH NEW REC

As we move into autumn, it is timely to provide an update on the various elements of the New Recreation Complex detailed here in terms of anticipated delivery:

Firstly, the full suite of "state of the art" Outdoor Fitness equipment has now been installed, and the <u>initial</u> ground works to accommodate safety fencing are also now complete. The safety fencing will be

installed along the front of the Art and Craft/Changing Room building, to the





point where it meets the Sports Hall (the steel framed structure). This work is planned to complete by Thursday 21st August in order for the wet pour soft play surface to be laid the following week. It is therefore hoped that this area will be open for public use by the time the new Primary School term starts, on 3rd September. Costing over £100k (paid for primarily through the

Cornwall Levelling Up Programme or CLUP), this facility should be with us for decades to come and so we sincerely hope it is respected.



The Planning Application to create an access ramp from Church Hill into the Recreation Ground has now been approved and the single Sycamore tree has been removed

REATION CENTRE — THE LATEST

(we are in a Conservation Area (CA) which means everything takes time) groundworks, ahead of which started as we go to print. Once again, we need to do this right and so it will take until late September/ mid October before this part of the project expected to be ready for use. Funded primarily through the Parish Council and donations, once done this will achieve a long-held



objective as the ramp will finally allow folk of all ages and abilities to access this space.

Now on to the most visible feature of the project, our new Recreation Centre,

which split into t w o separate parts. the Art and Craft building and the Sports Hall. In short, our prime contractor е s p Developments Ltd were going great guns until month ago and we had hoped to see the side panels.



roof trusses and maybe even the roof on the building by now. However, the funders for this part of the wider project (Cornwall Council's Shared Prosperity Fund (SPF) Team) needed to undertake a Value for Money (VfM) assessment in order to release promised monies. This delay is clearly a massive blow to all concerned, esp. those volunteers trying to get this project done, but it is hoped that Vespa will be back onsite inside the next fortnight to 3 weeks - we hope the September weather will hold out long enough to allow us to get the building watertight and secure.



Never idle, your Team of volunteers have been working extremely hard in the margins to secure additional funds (circa £40k in all) to fit out the ground floor Kitchen and Changing Rooms, most of the kit and equipment for the Sports Hall and the Digital suite planned for the first floor rooms. They are also doing their very best to seek the necessary funds to restore the football pitch to better than its former glory!

In sum, this is a hugely ambitious project but we are slowly getting there. Everyone is trying their hardest, sleepless nights are common and those involved are going above and beyond what would ordinarily be expected of any volunteer, so please bear with us.

MEDO CAFE It has been a busy few months at the MEDO Cafe and lovely to welcome so many new members. We were delighted to host a visit from

the children at Threemilestone School again with their favourite toys and then playing a variety of games with our members. Helston Museum brought a really interesting selection of old cookery and household items which many of us remembered from years gone by. Our summer party consisted of a visit from the Made Theatre followed by a delicious cream tea. Of course, we had our selection of music, exercise and chair yoga with air fragrances followed by relaxation head massages.

Our autumn programme is full of interest and laughter. On Monday 6th October, after running for a year, it will be our first birthday for the cafe and we will be celebrating with fun and birthday cake.

We hope all our members have had a wonderful summer and we look forward to you all joining us again on 1st and 3rd Mondays of each month in the lounge bar at The Victoria Inn, Threemilestone, Truro between 2.15 and 4.15. Village Pondwatch - August '25

Plant growth all around is lush and green, but the pond is shrinking as the water level drops steadily – evaporating into the warm breezes. A big black snail leaves tracks on the liner as it grazes through the silt near the water's edge.



Despite strong gusts of wind, several azure damselflies dodge among the reeds. One or two venture out across the pond and soon return to rest on a leaf. When the sun shines, many more drift among the reed stems and fly out back and forth over the water. Mated pairs also emerge in tandem and settle on floating weed as a much larger dragonfly suddenly arrives. distinctive lime-green head, darkbanded body with bright blue tail-tip identify it as a male Southern Hawker. His wings glitter light bronze in the sun



as he hunts up and down the pond before he flies away over the Green. Three red darter dragonflies furiously contest the airspace above the pond. They spiral rapidly upwards to the trees and swoop back over the water. Eventually, they return to their perches around the pond. Sometime later a mated pair of red darters bobs up and down, letting the female dip her tail repeatedly into the water. They carry on when a lone male flies in to harass them – eventually they move away to a different part of the pond. Meanwhile, a large Southern Hawker dragonfly hunts vigorously around the pond. It is chased briefly by a mated pair of red darters flying in tandem. The larger hawker moves on and the red darters return to placing eggs.

A small wren hops from the willow bush into the reeds, where she disturbs a female Hawker dragonfly. The insect flies from the reeds and flutters quite feebly up into the tree canopy. In the open water, many water -boatman beetles constantly patrol and



track one another – but at a more measured pace than the dragonflies. Bees hum amidst the purple loosestrife flowers while a wasp crashes into the open water and struggles to climb onto a drifting stalk. Another wasp hovers over the pond before it lands on floating weeds.

Community Garden

There is a quiet air of satisfaction amongst gardeners at this time of year as the sowing, tending and planting from earlier months yields results. We have had a quieter month as holidays are taken and fewer jobs vital, although there is always something to be done.

Woodwork around the site has been treated to a fresh coat of preservative and maintenance work has been necessary on the water pumping system - thank you to the people involved in these important tasks. The usual weeding and grass trimming continues with our constant battle fireweed (Rosebay against Willowherb), which has a great ability to hide in the middle of a planting area and spreads itself around before you even notice it! Our other enemy is ever present brambles, although the more established areas are giving very tasty fruits just now and they go nicely in an apple and blackberry crumble.

We have fared slightly better this year with produce. The soft fruits did well but ripened very early and were over quickly. Peas are cropping well at the moment but like damp conditions, so we are keeping an eye on them. Newly planted rhubarb started growing but then disappeared - it takes time to establish so we are hoping it will come back when its roots are stronger. Once the greenhouse was cleared and the tomatoes and Basil planted it has gone from strength to strength with the promise of ripened fruit being available into the warmer autumn days. We have lost some of the early

set fruit on the apple trees but. with such r weather, trees have shown signs really struggling recently, we must look to next year



for our bumper harvest! On the lower terrace autumn raspberries are coming on and the sweetcorn is looking good – winners and losers. We learn and move on to think about next year. Do you have any ideas of planting arrangements or growing areas we could try?

As we move into autumn we start the process of clearing and tidying up. Our original rainbow bed is in need of sorting out and we will divide some of the plants as we rearrange the area. The prairie bed has performed well and given us a variety of colour in its first season, it will just be tidied and mulched for the colder months with one or two plants replaced where they failed to grow.

All are welcome at the garden, it is open for all at any time and is a very relaxing place to take a walk or sit and enjoy the view. Come along to one of our sessions (Wednesday and Saturday 10am – 1ish) or just join us for coffee and a chat. We'd love to see you!
